# **Purpose of Report**

**Reasons for Recommendations** 

#### Introduction

This report updates members on matters carried over from previous meetings and other items not included on the agenda.

1. The visit to the East Sussex Record Office took place on 9 February. Members of the Committee were given a tour of the facilities, including store, search room and conservation laboratory. Examples of digitised maps were shown and a selection of documents relating to Hastings was on view, including a newly acquired photograph album showing Mayors Ford and Blackman's official duties from 1924-1940.

The Curator was presented with a copy of the list of pre-1835 Hastings Corporation Records which are now fully catalogued, and has subsequently received a digital copy together with copies and a list of the newly acquired photographs. A request will be made for the Museum to receive copies of all digitised archive material relating to Hastings. A visit to the Keep will be organised for 2013.

- 2. An order has been placed to erect the commemorative plaque to Sidney Little at the eastern end of Bottle Alley. A date is still awaited for the ceremony to unveil the plaque to Alan Turing on Baston Lodge.
- 3. Permission has been given for the reproduction of the following images etc from the Museum's collection:
  - Dr Sophie Thomas Director, MA in Literatures of Modernity Associate Professor,
    Department of English Ryerson University, Toronto. A drawing of feather cloaks
    from the Thomas Davies album for an essay called "Feather Cloaks and English
    Collectors" which will appear in an edited collection called 'Objects of Inquiry and
    Exchange: Eighteenth-Century Thing Theory in a Global Context'. This is a
    scholarly book with a print run of 1,000 to be published in Canada.
  - Dr Douglas Brown MPhil PhD (J L Baird and television technology historian)
     Director of the Strathclyde Science and Technology Forum. A photograph of
     Baird, permission for it s use has been given by Malcom Baird 'The Three
     Dimensions of John Logie Baird,' covering the technical development of
     monochrome, colour and 3DTV, commissioned by the Radio Society of Great
     Britain
  - Richard Pollard has requested a selection of local history images for a new title.
  - Stevel Brindle of English Heritage, who is preparing a new exhibition for the Wellington Arch at Hyde Park Corner, designed by Decimus Burton.. Permission to reuse a portrait of Decimus Burton which they have in their guidebook.
  - Dr D W Dykes, FSA, FRHistS Re use of an image of James Burton for an academic volume due to be published by Spink & Son Ltd. 'Coinage and Currency in Eighteenth-Century Britain: The Provincial Coinage'.
  - Elizabeth Nathaniels for images from the Burton collection for a second article in the 'Georgian Journal'.
