

BY-LAWS

RELATING TO THE

Parades, Stads, Foreshore & Sands.

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hastings, in the County of Sussex, acting by the Council under the powers of the Hastings Improvement Act, 1885, do hereby make the following By-laws for the preservation of order and good conduct among persons frequenting the Parades, Stads, Foreshore, and Sands within the said Borough, and do hereby impose the penalties and further penalties in the same By-laws mentioned.

No person shall do any of the following acts on the Parades, Stads, Foreshore, or Sands within the Borough of Hastings.

- (1.) Take part in any fighting, boxing, or wrestling match, or lie, sleep, sit, stand or rest in any indecent posture.

(2.) Carelessly or negligently injure, deface, remove, or disfigure by posting or painting, any bill, placard, or notice, on any groyne, fence, barrier, notice board, or other thing put up by the Corporation of Hastings.

(3) Except as hereinafter provided,

(a) erect or place on the Parades, Stade, Foreshore, or Sands, within the said Borough any Booth, Tent, Shed, Stand, Stall, Show, Exhibition, Swing, Round-about, or other similar erection, or bring thereon any van, photographic cart, or other vehicle.

(b) give or exhibit on any part of the said Parades, Stade, Foreshore, or Sands, any performance, or deliver thereon any address, lecture, sermon, or speech, of any kind or description whatsoever, or hold or take part in any public assemblage.

Provided that nothing in this By-law shall prohibit

(a) the erection or placing of any Booth, Tent, or other such erection as aforesaid, or the bringing of any van, photographic cart, or other such vehicle as aforesaid, or

(b) the giving or exhibiting of any performance, or the delivery of any address, lecture, sermon, or speech, or the holding of any orderly public assemblage

upon such portion or portions of the Parades, Stade, Foreshore, or Sands aforesaid, which the Corporation shall from time to time, by notice affixed or set up thereon, appoint for the purpose, and subject to such conditions and such regulations as the Corporation may from time to time prescribe, and of which notice shall be given by placards posted on or near such portion or portions of the Parades, Stade, Foreshore, or Sands so appointed as aforesaid.

(4) Sound or play upon any musical instrument or sing or make any noise whatsoever on any part of the Parades, Stade, Foreshore, or Sands within the said Borough, so as to be or occasion any nuisance or annoyance, or disturbance, to any householder resident in any house near to or adjoining such Parades, Stade, Foreshore, or Sands, and after having been requested by such householder, or by any Police Constable to desist from making such

noise or noises, either on account of illness of any inmate of such house, or for any reasonable cause.

Penalties.

Every person who shall offend against any provision of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of FIVE POUNDS, and for every continuing offence to a further penalty of Forty Shillings for each day on which the offence continues after written notice thereof shall have been given to him by the Council. Provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court, before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty hereby imposed.

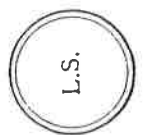
Provided further that an officer or servant of the Council or a person duly authorised by the Council in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk shall not be liable to any penalty in respect of any act done by such officer, servant, or person within the scope of his employment, or in pursuance of the authority so conferred upon him.

Saving for rights of Crown.

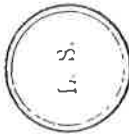
Provided nothing in these By-laws contained shall in any way prejudice Her Majesty,

Her heirs and successors or Her or their tenants or lessees of foreshore belonging to Her or them, in the use, occupation, and enjoyment of any such foreshore.

CONDITIONS & REGULATIONS

prescribed by the Corporation of Hastings under the By-laws relating to the Parades, Stads, Foreshore, and Sands within the Borough made by the Council under the powers of the Hastings Improvement Act, 1885, and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 27th August, 1896.

1.--ADDRESSES, LECTURES, SERMONS OR SPEECHES may be delivered, and any orderly Public Assemblage may be held on the STADE OR FORESHORE (but not on the Parades) at the places, and subject to the conditions hereunder set forth :—

PLACE.	CONDITIONS.
(a). Marina—between the Concrete Groyne opposite Market Street and the East end of the lower Parade at South Colonnade.	A person delivering any such address, lecture, sermon, or speech, or holding any such orderly public meeting must do so between the hours of 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. and 7.15 p.m. and 9 p.m. on Sundays and 7.15 p.m. and 9 p.m. on Week days, must keep at a distance of at least 50 yards from any other person delivering an address, lecture, sermon or speech, or holding a public assemblage and must not cause any obstruction on any Parade, or use any language which is of an offensive character, or calculated to cause a breach of the peace.
(b). Warrior Square between a point measured 25 yards East of the Western corner of the lower enclosure and a point measured 25 yards West of the Eastern corner of such enclosure.	
(c). White Rock—between the East end of the Baths and the Concrete Groyne at the West end of Carlisle Parade.	
(d). Carolina Place, Breeds Place, Beach Terrace, Marino Parade and East Parade—between the East side of the Concrete Groyne No. 16 at the West end of Carolina Place and the West side of the Concrete Groyne No. 7A at East Parade.	
(e). Fishmarket, Rock-a-Nore—between a point in a line with the East end of the Public Convenience for men at the Fishmarket and the West side of the block of Kopp Shoppa at Rock-a-Nore distinguished by the Letter R.	
(f). Rock-a-Nore—between the Eastern Boundary of the Drill Hall and the proposed Eastern arm of the Harbour (No. 2 Concrete Groyne).	

2.—PERFORMANCES may given or exhibited on week-days on the Stade, Foreshore, or Sands (but not on the Parades) at the following places, and subject to the following conditions :

PLACE.	CONDITIONS.
<p>On such parts only of the Stade, Foreshore or Sands (excepting any place assigned in Clause I for the delivery of lectures, etc., between the hours of 7.15 p.m. and 9 p.m.) as may be assigned by the Chief Constable of the Borough on the written application of the person or persons responsible for the performance.</p>	<p>That such performances shall take place only for such limited time and upon such terms as may in each case be prescribed by the Chief Constable of the Borough and that no nuisance, annoyance or obstruction is caused by such performance to persons frequenting the Parades, Stade, Foreshore and Sands.</p>

3.—SHOWS and EXHIBITIONS may be erected or placed and PHOTOGRAPHIC CARTS or other similar vehicles may be brought on the Stade, Foreshore, and Sands (but not on the

Parades) at the places, and subject to the conditions hereunder set forth.

PLACE.	CONDITIONS.
<p>On such parts of the Stade, Foreshore, or Sands only, as may be assigned by the Chief Constable of the Borough on the written application of the Proprietor of such erection or vehicle.</p>	<p>That the said show or exhibition, or photographic cart or other vehicle, must not be of such a size or description as to cause an obstruction or to unduly interfere with the enjoyment by the public of the Parades, Stade, Foreshore or Sands, and shall be placed or brought on the Stade, Foreshore or Sands only for such limited time as may in each case be prescribed by the Chief Constable of the Borough, and that neither the Proprietor nor any person on his behalf shall tout or importune any person on the Parades.</p>

The above Conditions and Regulations were adopted under the Common Seal, at a Meeting of the Council of the Borough of Hastings held on the 4th day of August, 1911.

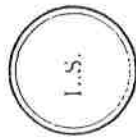
CONDITIONS & REGULATIONS

prescribed by the Corporation of Hastings under the By-laws relating to the Parades, Stads, Fore-shore, and Sands within the Borough, which By-laws were made by the Council under the powers of the Hastings Improvement Act, 1885, and were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 27th August, 1896.

TENTS may be erected or placed on the STADE, FORESHORE, OR SANDS, at the places, and subject to the conditions hereunder set forth.

PLACE	CONDITIONS
(a) At Grand Parade—Between Groyves Nos. 35 and 37.	The tent to be put up, used, and removed, at the owner's own risk and responsibility, and otherwise upon such terms as may in each case be prescribed by the Town Clerk of the Borough, and is to be removed every evening, not later than dusk.
(b) Opposite Eversfield Place—Between Groyves Nos. 28 and 29.	
(c) Opposite Beach Terrace and Breeds Place—Between Groyves Nos. 12 and 14	
(d) At Fishmarket—Between East Side of Lifeboat House and Western arm of Harbour Works.	

The above Conditions and Regulations were adopted under the Common Seal at a Meeting of the Council of the Borough of Hastings held on the 7th day of May, 1920.

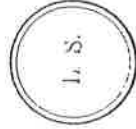
CONDITIONS & REGULATIONS

prescribed by the Corporation of Hastings under the By-laws relating to the Parades, Stads, Fore-shore, and Sands within the Borough, which By-laws were made by the Council under the powers of the Hastings Improvement Act, 1885, and were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 27th August, 1896.

TENTS may be erected or placed on the STADE, FORESHORE, OR SANDS, at the places, and subject to the conditions hereunder set forth.

PLACE	CONDITIONS
(a) At Grand Parade—Between Groyves Nos. 35 and 37.	The tent to be put up, used, and removed, at the owner's own risk and responsibility, and otherwise upon such terms as may in each case be prescribed by the Town Clerk of the Borough, and is to be removed every evening, not later than dusk.
(b) Opposite Eversfield Place—Between Groyves Nos. 28 and 29.	
(c) Opposite Beach Terrace and Breeds Place—Between Groyves Nos. 12 and 14.	

The above Conditions and Regulations were adopted under the Common Seal at a Meeting of the Council of the Borough of Hastings held on the 5th day of March, 1926.

County Borough of Hastings.

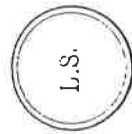
BYE-LAWS

made by The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Hastings acting by the Council under the powers of the Hastings Improvement Act, 1885, for the preservation of order and good conduct among persons frequenting the Parades, Stads, Foreshore and Sands, within the said County Borough.

(1) A person shall not cause or incite any dog on the Parades, Stads, Foreshore or Sands within the County Borough of Hastings to bark to the annoyance of any person after being required to desist by any Beach Inspector appointed by the Corporation, or by any Police Constable.

(2) Any person who shall offend against the foregoing Bye-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

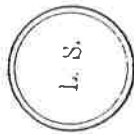
