Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1) If this premises licence authorises the supply/sale of alcohol, the following two conditions apply:
 - (i) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
 - (ii) Every supply/sale of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence
- 2) If this premises licence authorises the exhibition of films the admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with this section.
 - Hastings Borough Council will expect the age restrictions of the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) or authority designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 to be complied with. Only in exceptional cases will variations of this general rule be granted by the Council and then only with the appropriate safeguards
- 3) If this premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity (as defined by the Private Security Industry Act 2001) then such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

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Annex 1A – Additional mandatory licensing conditions

In relation to an existing or future relevant premises licence, the conditions specified for the purposes of section 19(4)(b) of the Act (mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises).

In relation to an existing or future relevant club premises certificate, the conditions specified for the purposes of section $73A(\mathbf{c})$ of the Act (mandatory conditions relating to the supply of alcohol to members or guests, for consumption on the premises).

Paragraphs 1, 2 & 3 effective from 6th April 2010.

- **1.**—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

Annex 1A - Additional mandatory licensing conditions - continued

- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- **2.** The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- **3.** The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Paragraphs 4 & 5 – effective from 1st October 2010.

4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

General

To carry out a risk assessment to cover the four licensing objectives.

To ensure health & safety certificates are up to date and valid for all equipment being used in public area (i.e. electrics, machinery, food).

To carry out a noise impact assessment and develop an appropriate management strategy.

To ensure at all events there are first aid holders on site.

Large event organisers should provide an operating schedule.

The prevention of crime & disorder

To ensure that large event organisers liaise with the relevant authorities (i.e. Hastings Police, Emergency Services and relevant HBC departments).

To provide adequate measures in terms of stewards, or SIA registered door supervisors.

To prevent overcrowding and fencing off areas that are not for public access (i.e. so no member of the public can access generators).

Although this area is a 'designated area' prohibiting the consumption of alcohol in the street / public places, the grant of a premises licence will authorise the sale of alcohol at pre-planned / organised events and the consumption of alcohol although not a licensable activity, will be authorised within the specified boundary of the licensed area.

Public safety

To carry out an event risk assessment and develop a management strategy to reduce risk levels to acceptable levels

To make sure event organisers provide adequate number of staff stewards / SIA registered door supervisors, to control public safety.

Briefings to be given by event organisers to staff etc. on procedures to be followed.

To prevent overcrowding and fencing off areas that are not for public access (i.e. so no member of public can access generators).

Stewards must keep customers who are drinking alcohol from leaving the designated licensed area.

The prevention of public nuisance

To ensure appropriate measures are taken to reduce any noise and vibration emissions that come from the premises.

To consult with the Environmental Health Noise Pollution department in respect of the proposed equipment to be used.

To implement the advice given using reasonable steps to reduce noise complaints.

To be responsible for the provision of adequate litter bins, the collection and disposal of litter and refuse after the event. This may be provided by HBC under contract subject to hirer's requirements.

The protection of children from harm

To ensure appropriate measures are taken by event organisers to protect children from harm. Organisers to ensure that valid and current police CRB checks are undertaken on any staff directly involved with the supervision of children.

No alcohol to be sold to under 18's. If uncertain of an individuals age, Challenge under 21yrs to ask individuals for photographic identification as proof of age.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE

GRANT

We have listened carefully to all the submissions and we are bound to be directed by the promotion of the Licensing Objectives and Material Considerations of:

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Protection of Children from Harm

<u>RESOLVED</u> (unanimously) that the application be GRANTED subject to the following conditions:

- 1. amplified music shall not be performed on more than 15 days per year in total as an aggregate of both this site and the Stade Beach;
- events involving amplified music shall not be performed on more than a single weekday or three consecutive days when commencing Friday and running into a normal weekend or four consecutive days when commencing Friday and running into a bank holiday weekend and, in any case, not more frequently than once fortnightly;
- 3. amplified music, including public announcements except in an emergency, shall be performed only between the hours of 10.00am and 21.00pm;
- 4. amplified music that may be more than barely audible outside noise sensitive properties shall not be performed for more than one hour continuously and for not more than six hours in aggregate on a single day with a minimum break of 30 minutes between each individual session;
- 5. events involving amplified music shall not take place after 18.00pm on any day that is followed by a school day;
- 6. the erection or dismantling of any structure required for an event shall take place only between the hours of 08.00am and 18.00pm Monday to Saturday and 10.00am to 18.00pm on Sundays and Bank Holidays;
- 7. music noise levels, at the northern boundary of the road A259 or beyond, shall not exceed 65dB(LAeq) over any 15 minute period. Noise monitoring positions shall be as directed with the Licensing Authority;
- 8. the music noise level at any point within the licensed area shall not exceed 95dB(LAeq) over any 15 minute period. In addition, the sound pressure level in either of the 63Hz or 125Hz octave frequency band shall not exceed 70dB at any time. Noise monitoring positions shall be agreed with the Licensing Authority;

- 9. nothing shall be broadcast, whether by speech or singing, in the course of any activity covered by this licence that may be offensive to any member of the public by reason of words used or sentiments expressed;
- 10. any public address system that is not part of a music sound system shall have sufficient speakers so located and orientated as to allow speech to be audible to persons within the licensed area but to be not more than barely audible at the boundary of any noise sensitive premises. Any announcements made through the music sound system shall meet the music noise levels specified in condition No.7; and
- 11. events shall be publicised by way of notice placed on the notice board of the adjacent Tourist Information Office and on the Hastings Borough Council website no less than two weeks in advance. This publicity shall include details of each event (date(s), timings and activities) together with a telephone number that may be used by the public to register any complaints about noise levels at any time during an event. Any such complaints from the public shall be passed immediately to a responsible person on site for investigation and corrective action as necessary. A detailed record of all complaints, including name, address and telephone number of the person calling together with details of the outcome shall be kept and a copy provided to the Licensing Authority not later than two weeks after the event.

Definitions:-

- i. amplified music is music, whether live or recorded, which is transmitted through and electronic sound system;
- ii. music includes that from the playing of instruments and performers singing, whether live or recorded;
- iii. Music Noise Level is the LAeq of the music noise measured at a particular location;
- iv. LAeq is the equivalent continuous sound pressure level which at a given location and over a give period of time contains the same A-weighted sound energy as the actual fluctuating noise at the same location over the same period;
- v. dB is the sound pressure level in decibels;
- vi. dB(A) is the A-weighted sound pressure level whereby various frequency components of sound are weighted (equalised) to reflect the way the human ear responds to different frequencies;
- vii. Noise Monitoring Position is the location of a microphone from which the level of sound is measured; and
- viii. Noise Sensitive Premises includes premises used for residential purposes, hospitals or similar institutions, education establishments (when in use), places of worship (during recognised times and days of worship), places of work during working hours or any other premises likely to be adversely affected by noise.

Reasons for granting this application:

- 1. the Committee has had regard to the statutory licensing objectives, in particular with regard to public nuisance and public safety; and
- 2. all other licensing objectives have been considered and form the basis of the decision.
