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Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1) If this premises licence authorises the supply/sale of alcohol, the following two conditions apply:
 - (i) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
 - (ii) Every supply/sale of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

- 2) If this premises licence authorises the exhibition of films the admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with this section.

Hastings Borough Council will expect the age restrictions of the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) or authority designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 to be complied with. Only in exceptional cases will variations of this general rule be granted by the Council and then only with the appropriate safeguards

- 3) If this premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity (as defined by the Private Security Industry Act 2001) then such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 1A – Additional mandatory licensing conditions

In relation to an existing or future relevant premises licence, the conditions specified for the purposes of section 19(4)(b) of the Act (mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises).

In relation to an existing or future relevant club premises certificate, the conditions specified for the purposes of section 73A(c) of the Act (mandatory conditions relating to the supply of alcohol to members or guests, for consumption on the premises).

Paragraphs 1, 2 & 3 effective from 6th April 2010.

1.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

Annex 1A – Additional mandatory licensing conditions - continued

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Paragraphs 4 & 5 – effective from 1st October 2010.

4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Annex 1A – Additional mandatory licensing conditions - continued

5. The responsible person shall ensure that–

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures–
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Embedded Restrictions

On Licences

The restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) consumption of alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises
- b) the sale of alcohol to a trader of club for the purposes of the trade or club
- c) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces
- d) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- e) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of alcohol so supplied, of the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on in charge of the business on the premises.

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Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

General.

To ensure continued compliance with the four aspects of good licensing practice as stated by the local licensing authority, the Chief Fire Officer and Chief Police Officer.

To comply with the standard conditions of the Public Entertainment Licence (PEL).

To comply with the conditions as follows:-

- a) all windows shall be kept closed after 23.00 hours
- b) all doors shall be kept closed after 23.00 hours except for the purpose of persons entering or exiting the premises.

To comply with the requirements of the PEL in respect of limitation on numbers of persons on the premises, namely:-

Ground floor – 80 persons when not closely seated (45 persons when seated)

Basement - 90 persons when not closely seated (50 when seated)

To comply with the requirements of the PEL in respect of noise to monitor and not to exceed the noise levels of:-

- a) up until 23.00 hours - overall sound pressure level of 70 decibels
- b) after 23.00 hours – overall sound pressure level of 65 decibels.

The prevention of crime & disorder.

To ensure that door supervisors are SIA registered.

To ensure that CCTV recording the area of the front door of the premises & tapes are stored and retained in accordance with guidelines and accessibility BY appropriate authorities.

Public safety.

To comply with the requirements as specified by the Chief Fire Officer, in respect of fire exits, emergency signage, emergency lighting, alarm systems and fire fighting equipment.

To maintain and re-evaluate when identified, any health & safety risk assessment.

The prevention of public nuisance.

All doors and windows to be kept closed after 23.00 hours.

The protection of children from harm.

To ensure no sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18 years by means of production on request of suitable identification document.

Agreed conditions with Police added at time of minor variation

Sussex Police Licensing to be notified of all “under 18 events” at least seven days prior to event.

No Alcohol will be served and no alcohol brought into venue during the period of the “under 18 event”.

The entire premises will be alcohol free and dedicated totally to the “under 18 event”.

Management of the premises will conduct a risk assessment for each “under 18 event” and will employ sufficient numbers of SIA approved/registered security staff and/or student leaders to facilitate the management of the premises and conduct a security role. Students will not be allowed to leave the premises without a student leader first being informed.

SIA security staff and / or student team leaders will be located throughout the venue and will be vigilant and constantly monitor the students for any alcohol or drug related incidents as well as possible sexual harassment.

A period of one hour will lapse between the end of the “under 18 event” and the commencement of normal premises hours as specified on the premises licence.
