Background

This report updates members on matters carried over from previous meetings, which are not included on the agenda.

1. Purchases

The Bronze Age palstaves from Pett, acquired through the Treasure Act, are now at the Museum but require conservation before they can be put on display.

Updates on other offers to purchase are included in the confidential appendix.

2. Loans

The portrait of Signor de Rossi by Walter Sickert, on loan to the Dulwich Picture Gallery, remained there for a further period. The exhibition 'Sickert in Venice' was extended to 7 June due to its popularity. The insurance cover was also extended.

The exhibition 'Destination Normandie -Deux siècle's de tourisme' at the Musée de Normandie, Caen opened on 12 June and will continue until 31 October 2009. Hastings Museum has lent 3 engravings of early 19th century Hastings and St Leonards.

3. Sponsorship of Museum Objects

At the last meeting the Committee supported the idea of looking into the principle of sponsorship. It was agreed that the word 'adopt' an object might be less controversial than 'sponsor'.

Mrs Purdey has done some research and finds that the position as regards Local Government funded museums is unclear. The Hastings and St Leonards Museum Association will await the findings of the Borough Council's Legal Services team before deciding how to proceed with the scheme.

4. Conservation of Feather Cloak

The Hawaiian Feather Cloak has now been conserved following the loan to the Musée de Quai Branly in Paris last year. It is still at the Textile Conservancy Studio where it is being remounted on a new stretcher. The Acting Curator is to visit soon to check on progress.
