1. Attendances: Hastings Museum and Art Gallery

The figures for October to December 2008 are given for comparison.

3. Website hits

The website statistics for the HBC websites are now obtained from a different source, Google Analytics, and present a different set of statistics to those previously reported. The only figure which can be used for comparison with the same quarter 2008 is the pages viewed, which last year was 18,649.

Oct - Dec 2009:

Visits: 5,320

Pages viewed: 23,942

New Visits: 84.70%

There are many different aspects of the statistics which can be recorded, including the fact that visitors came from 79 different countries, with the most from the UK followed by the USA, down to single visits from Papua New Guinea, Cameroon and Yemen.



4. Comment

The visitor figures for Johns Place show a rise of almost 20% on the same quarter last year, although the visitors in educational groups for the same period have stayed the same. The rise can be attributed to the popularity of the Indian Summer exhibition and all the associated events.

The impact of the Old Town TIC being moved to the Old Town Hall Museum, in November 2009, has not yet shown in the number of visitors recorded.
