Reference:	Name:	Location:	Date of origin	Condition
S1	Harold and Edith	Grosvenor Gardens	1875	Very poor, (photograph provided at the meeting)
S2	Lion and Unicorn	Robertson Terrace	Early 1800's	Very poor – (responsibility of Albany Court Residents Association)
S3	Queen Victoria	Warrior Square	1903	Good
S4	Albert	Stored in the Greenhouse – Alexandra Park	1864	Carving is badly weathered especially on its right flank. It is also dirty and stained; currently covered in sheeting to protect. (photograph provided at the meeting)
S5	Queen Anne	Holmhurst St. Mary	1712	Originally from the front of St. Pauls Cathedral the statue was damaged and discarded. Brought to Hastings in 1893 and restored at that time. Ownership not clear. Now in poor condition and suggested for further restoration and re-location through section 106 by the developer of the Holmhurst St. Mary housing scheme.

M1	Waldegrave Fountain	Robertson Street	1861	Cleaned and restored circa 1995
M2	Burton Memorial Tomb	West Hill Road	1837	Restored 1995 and recently repaired 2009. (Photograph provided at the meeting)
M3	Costello Memorial Fountain	Marina	1908	Good/ part weathered; some restoration in 1997
M4	Burton Memorial Fountain	Gloucester Lodge	1880	The monument is situated in the garden of Gloucester Lodge and is currently missing the bronze cameo of James Burton, this is in the possession of the owner. The remainder is in fair condition and has had the surrounding vegetation cut back to expose the memorial, which can now be viewed from St. Leonards Gardens.

O1	Boundary Stone	Grand Parade	1898	Some weathering and fissuring; pencil marks in lettering
O2	Conqueror's Table	Marina	N/A	Small amounts of erosion, bronze plaque corrosion
O3	Thomas Holt Memorial stone	The Bourne	1995	Some scratching
O4	Bust of Victoria	The Museum	N/A	Marble in good condition, but some staining
O5	The East Well	Rock A Nore	1848	Some weathering and degrading to mortar, restoration is recommended in medium term.
O6	"Roman" Bath	Summerfields Woods	1830	Some wall repairs carried out in early 1990's other wall damage exists and names have been carved in the stone.
O7	Commemorative Tablet	All Saints Church Wall	1873	Severely weathered and mostly illegible.
O8	Lamp stands	St. Clements Church	N/A	Cast iron lamps in very poor condition, these are regarded as a priority for replacement/restoration
O9	Drinking Fountain	Gillsman's Hill	1873	Some erosion and previous inappropriate restoration. Vegetative growth needs removal and regular cleaning
O10	Large Anchor	The Fishermen's Museum	1811	Iron is corroding badly and wood is very desiccated, and splitting
O11	Gate from St. Pauls Cathedral	The Museum	1710	Blistering paint and corrosion, and treated to stop deterioration
O12	Ship's frapping	The Museum	N/A	Iron corroding and soiling of the sandstone, treat iron.
O13	Boundary Markers (2 no.)	The Museum (set in flower bed)	19 th . Cent.	Iron corroding – treat with anti-corrosion

O14	Anchor	The Museum	19 th . Cent	Severely corroded. Is this the anchor used by fishermen to pull their boats out, linked to Burton St. Leonards history??

O16	Two lamps from Albert Memorial	The Museum – (flanking the main entrance)	1863	Reasonably sound, restored recently.
O17	Two Coats of Arms	The Museum	Early 19 th . Cent	Some erosion and surface soiling
O18	Continuum	Alexandra Park – boating lake	Contemporary	Stainless steel, requires annual cleaning
O19	Fishing Boat	Station Approach	Contemporary	Satisfactory
