Introduction

Confirmation has been received from Frances Bedford, State Member for Florey, South Australia, that the Muriel Matters Society wishes to proceed with the plaque.

The wording has been decided, and the plaque ordered. Listed Building Consent for 7 Pelham Crescent has been applied for. The Conservation Officer advises that as HBC owns the Grade II* listed building, advice has to be sought from English Heritage, a process which can take 12 weeks.

Ms Bedford is hoping that the unveiling ceremony can take place during Old Town Week, possibly on 4 August, when a delegation from the South Australia State Parliament, including the Speaker, the Hon Lyn Breuer, will attend. She is also hoping to arrange a function at St Mary-in-the Castle.

The Curator has advised Ms Bedford of the time-scale needed to arrange the plaque, and will continue to keep her informed of progress.
