The Museum is also working with East Sussex Art Partnership and Hastings Youth Council to develop a project for Word County that offers a focus for stories, histories and journeys of people from different cultural backgrounds. This project, DJ VJ, will use multi-media and culminate in an event during Coastal Currents in September 2010.
