Citizens' Panel Questions

1. We have identified the following principles that will underpin our budget for 2007/08 and help us set our plans for the next 3 years. We would like to know the extent to which you agree or disagree that these principles should guide our future activities.

Our principles are to:

- Continue our primary focus on the regeneration of Hastings and St Leonards
- Prioritise activities that contribute to improving the town's 5 E's. These are:
 - § Economy
 - § Education
 - § Employment
 - § Environment (including Housing)
 - § Enjoyment
- Provide good quality, customer focussed cost effective services
- Focus on affordability and recognise that our financial position means we have to make every penny count.
- Ensure our expenditure is in line with income and we focus on our 'core' activities and work with others to bring in external funds for anything extra.
- Recognise that we may not be able to deliver as wide a range of services in future
- Increase joint-working with local authority partners and others to share resources, improve the quality, resilience and cost efficiency of our services
- Deliver services in the most efficient, effective and equitable way either inhouse or by others in the private or voluntary sector.
- Make savings by not funding activities which can be funded from elsewhere
- Keep Hastings Borough Council's Council Tax increase as low as possible whilst providing the services the town needs.
- Recognise that the Council cannot be a funder of last resort when funding from other sources is reduced or ends.

Services in your local area are provided by a number of bodies. In Hastings, some of these services such as Childrens Services, Adult Social Services, Transport and Libraries are provided by East Sussex County Council. The services outlined in this

consultation document are provided by Hastings Borough Council, in partnership with other agencies where stated.

- 3. Are key partners in creating new and better employment, training and other opportunities for local people
- 4. Support the growth of and investment in local business through the local enterprise growth initiative and other economic programmes
- 5. Use the planning process to deliver housing, employment and environmental benefits
- 6. Guide physical developments and protect the built environment through the Local Development framework
- 7. Use planning to enforce seafront and town centre improvements and building regulations to ensure new developments are safe
- 8. Provide guidelines on conservation and design to ensure that new developments respect our heritage and promote innovative design
- 9. Teach vocational skills to young people who've left school with few or no qualifications
- 10. Offer advice to reduce and prevent homelessness
- 11. Work with housing providers to match housing supply to local needs

- 17. Deal with licensing applications such as licenses to allow the sale or supply of alcohol, entertainments and hackney carriage/private hire vehicles
- 18. Work with the police and other partners to tackle anti-social behaviour and reduce crime

- 19. Prepare contingency plans to deal with crisis or disasters such as flooding, fire, terrorism
- 20. Protect public health by ensuring that food outlets comply with food safety and health and safety laws, monitor air quality and deal with noise pollution
- 21. Manage the Highways (on behalf of the County Council) by maintaining our roads, pavements and road signs
- 22. Collect rubbish and provide opportunities for recycling

- 30. Provide opportunities for people of all ages to take part in sport through our Active Hastings Programme
- 31. Hold play events and maintain play facilities for children and young people
- 32. Support the Arts by supporting projects such as Coastal Currents and maintaining St. Mary in the Castle as an Arts venue
- 33. Provide entertainment through the White Rock Theatre
- 34. Manage Hastings cemetery and crematorium
- 35. Collect Council Tax
- 36. Distribute Housing and Council Tax Benefits and tackle fraud
- 37. Provide a range of services through the Hastings Information Centre
- 38. Oversee elections and voting
- 39. Manage the Council's portfolio of land and property used for employment
- 40. Market Hastings as a tourist destination
