# **Quarter 2 Financial Summary**

#### Council-wide Quarter 2 Revenue Spend

- Revenue Budget At the end of quarter two a number of significant variations have been identified but the overall financial position is a balanced one of spend against budget.
- 2. The more significant variations include savings from the new Leisure Contract, possible savings due to reduced payments on Concessionary Fares, increased rental income due to a reduction in voids and reductions in income within Development Control.

There have been losses in grants as follows:

- 3. Of the total LAA (Local Area Agreement) reward grant reduction £70,000 is attributable to revenue. The losses in ABG have been addressed by reductions in the project costs. The loss of free swimming grant has a nil effect to the Council's budget as it was passed on to Freedom Leisure.
- 4. Capital Programme the gross expenditure on the capital programme is £12,380K. Approximately 1.7 million of expenditure will be re-profiled into 2011/12 in respect of the CCTV Control Room, the Castle Improvements/East Hill Café and Factory Refurbishment (ACE Answers in the carbon Economy). There are three new schemes namely, Income Management System, Celandine Playground and Empty Homes Strategy CPO (compulsory purchase order). The revised capital programme for 10/11 is estimated at £10,542K. It is anticipated that after applying capital receipts and grants the Council will have a borrowing requirement of £1,391K.
