The Council has committed to installing 15 public charging points by the end of this financial year, in support of delivering its climate emergency commitments to make Hastings carbon neutral by 2030. This investment will support and enable residents, businesses and visitors to travel to the town centre, with the knowledge and confidence that they will be able to charge their electric vehicle. Such investment will support the transition to low carbon vehicles and help to meet the towns climate emergency action plan and improve local air quality.</p>
