Purpose of Report

To consider an Objection Notice to a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) served on behalf of Dragon Bar, 71 George Street, Hastings, TN34 3EE. Responsible Authorities. One.

Recommendation(s)

1. The Sub-Committee considers the Temporary Event Notice in the light of the objection notice made by Sussex Police and resolves to take such steps as it considers appropriate and proportionate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and determine whether to serve a counter notice.

Reasons for Recommendations

The Sub-Committee must consider the oral representations and information given at the hearing before reaching a decision



Introduction

1.0 Background

- 1. On 7th February 2005 the Licensing Act 2003 came into force for all local authorities, marking the practical commencement of the Government's new liquor licensing regime.
- On the 8th December 2021, Hastings Borough Council was served a Temporary Events Notice in respect of Dragon Bar, 71 George Street, Hastings, TN34 3EE. (Attached at Appendix A).
- This premise holds a licence to operate until 23.30hrs under the Licensing Act 2003(Attached at Appendix B), The premise is located within Area 2 (Hastings Old Town) of the Council Special Saturation Policy (Cumulative Impact).

2.0 Application

4. The TEN application requests the following:

31st December 2021 23.00 hours until 02.00 hours on the following day, the 1st January 2022, for the public, then until 04.00 hours for staff and family.

3.0 Consultation

- 5. The Act provides for periods of notice and the number of events that may be held. Notice must be given to the Licensing Authority, Police and Environmental Protection ten working days before the beginning of the event period. The Police and Environmental Protection then have three working days to lodge objections with the Licensing Authority and Applicant. A copy of the Police objection notice to the TEN, which was received on 13th December 2021, is attached at **Appendix C**. Environmental Protection have not made any representations.
- 6. Objections must relate to the undermining of the licensing objectives, the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, the protection of children from harm. Copies of the application are required to be served on a list of responsible authorities at the same time as placing the application before the local authority, this has been done.

4.0 Legal Considerations

- 7. Part 5 of the 2003 Licensing Act provides a system of permitted temporary activities, under which licensable activities can be carried out on a temporary basis (for a period not exceeding 7 days) without the need for a premises licence or a club premises certificate.
- 8. If an objection notice to a temporary event notice is made by a responsible authority and no compromise can be reached between the parties, a hearing must be held.

- 9. Paragraph 7.28 of the Section 182 Guidance sets how the Authority should decide what actions are appropriate.
- 10. If the licensing authority receives an objection notice from the police or EHA that is not withdrawn, it must (in the case of a standard TEN only) hold a hearing to consider the objection unless all parties agree that this is unnecessary. The licensing committee may decide to allow the licensable activities to go ahead as stated in the notice. If the notice is in connection with licensable activities at licensed premises, the licensing authority may also impose one or more of the existing licence conditions on the TEN (insofar as such conditions are not inconsistent with the event) if it considers that this is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. If the authority decides to impose conditions, it must give notice to the premises user which includes a statement of conditions (a "notice (statement of conditions)") and provide a copy to each relevant party. Alternatively, it can decide that the event would undermine the licensing objectives and should not take place. In this case, the licensing authority must give a counter notice.
- The Department for Culture, Media and Sport has issued guidance under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. This guidance is provided to Licensing Authorities to assist them in carrying out their functions.
- 12. All members of the Licensing Committee have been supplied with copies of the DCMS Government guidance and the Hastings Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 13. Human rights considerations must be taken into account fully in balancing licensing issues, in particular, Article 1 of the first protocol and article 8. Article 1 relates to the protection of property and the peaceful enjoyment of possessions and property. Holding a premises licence would be considered a possession. Article 8 relates to the right to respect for private and family life, home and correspondence. These are however qualified rights and can be deprived of "in the public interest". Interference is permissible if what is done:-
- Has its basis in law;
- Is necessary in a democratic society to fulfil a pressing need or pursue a legitimate aim;
- Is proportionate to the aims being pursued; and,
- Is related to the prevention of crime; or, the protection of public order or health.

If members choose to issue a counter notice, the applicant has a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days but no later than five working days before the day on which the event period specified in the temporary event notice begins. There is also a right of appeal to conditions imposed as a result of the hearing by any person affected by the decision.

5.0 Options

Issue a Counter notice (refusal)

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

All Premises Licence authorising supply of alcohol

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence -
- (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
- (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions - continued

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. (1)The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2)The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3)The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-

- (a) a holographic mark or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
 - (i) beer or cider: ¹/₂ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions - continued

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D + (DxV)

Where -

(i)P is the permitted price

- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Ensure all staff are trained in Licensing Law.

Ensure that the zero tolerance in respect of illegal substances is operated within the premises.

Ensure staff do not serve persons who intoxicated or disruptive.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Following review on 26th June 2009, additional conditions were imposed. See Annex 3 following.

Ensure all fire exits, extinguishers and emergency exits are properly maintained and checked.

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

Following review on 26th June 2009, additional conditions were imposed. See Annex 3 following.

Ensure staff monitor noise levels in the building to ensure disturbance is not caused to residents.

<u>THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM</u> Following review on 26th June 2009, additional conditions were imposed. See Annex 3 following.

Persons over 14yrs and under 18yrs are admitted only if accompanied by an adult and if they have entered for a meal and before 18.00hrs.

Ensure staff operate a "No ID No sale" policy in respect of age sensitive goods.

Ensure staff only accept photographic evidence as proof of age.

- 1. Noise from music and patrons on the premises (including the outside area having a Highways Permit) shall be no more than barely audible within any neighbouring residential premises at any time as perceived by an authorised officer of Hastings Borough Council and not at all after 23:00 hours;
- 2. (AMENDED AT APPEAL HEARING ON 4th DECEMBER 2009) Use of plastic glasses (polycarbonate or similar) within the permitted highway area outside the premises after 21:00 hours on Friday and Saturday and after 14:00 hours on Bank Holiday Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays and special occasions as listed by Hastings Borough Council (for example Carnival);
- 3. Challenge 25 to replace current Challenge 21 Policy;
- 4. Street furniture to be folding or stackable for storage in pub overnight;
- 5. Personal Licence Holder to be supervising sales in person after 21:00 hours on Friday and Saturdays and after 14:00 hours on Bank Holiday Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays and special occasions as listed by Hastings Borough Council (for example Carnival);
- 6. Personal Licence Holder to supervise activity with the permitted drinking area in George Street after 21:00 hours on Friday and Saturday and after 14:00 hours on Bank Holiday Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays and special occasions as listed by Hastings Borough Council (for example Carnival);
- 7. On May Bank Holiday celebrations street furniture will not be placed on the highway permit areas or areas used by patrons, until the procession has passed;
- 8. Consumption of alcoholic drink within the permitted area in George Street to cease at 22:00 hours;
- 9. Customers not to be permitted to take alcoholic drink outside the designated permit area; and

10. A working log to be maintained as to all incidents (such as ejections, refusals, searches, drug seizures etc) which must be logged therein. The DPS to check the log not less than once per month, sign it off and where appropriate provide staff training on any issues arising.

The reason for this decision is as follows:



RE; TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE (TEN) FOR DRAGON BAR, 71 GEORGE STREET, HASTINGS, TN34 3EE NOTICE OF OBJECTION under Section 104 (2) of the Licensing Act 2003

Notice of objection is hereby given on behalf of the Chief Officer of Police for Sussex for the above TEN on the grounds of the licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder, public nuisance and public safety not being promoted.

The TEN was received on Friday 10th December 2021. The TEN seeks to licence the sale by retail of alcohol, supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club, the provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshments between the hours of 2330 – 0200 for the public and 2330 – 0400 for staff and family on the 1st January 2022.

Sussex Police has seen an increase in violence in the night time economy since lock down was lifted earlier this year. There is also the added concerns of violence against women and girls with an increase in suspected spiking incidents. Recently Sussex Police obtained up to date crime statistics to see if we had enough evidence to support the continuation of the Cumulative Impact Policy which is currently under consultation.

Our records show that George Street, is within the Hastings Cumulative Impact Policy, this TENS application does not provide any information on how this policy will be achieved and as such undermines the licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder, public nuisance and public safety not being promoted. Recent crime data shows that George Street, has the highest crime rate within Old Hasting ward, with this premises being within the hot zone.

The application also implies that there will be illegal trading from 0200 – 0400 where members of the public will be excluded from the premises for a family / staff celebration.

Therefore, the Chief Officer of Police contends that permitting TEN to be used in accordance with the notice is likely to undermine the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder, public nuisance and public safety.
