Dear Mr Brown

Under the licensing regime the role of the Environmental Health is to avoid the creation of situations where new licenses, by virtue of their proposed activities, their locations, or times of operation, give rise to a justifiable nuisance to local residents. In this respect the provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and the Noise Act 1996 provide some protection to the general public from the effects of noise nuisance, however, as the DCMS guidance recognises these may not, by themselves, be sufficient to protect local residents.

Following complaints regarding noise from the above premises action was taken to serve a formal noise abatement notice following the witnessing of a breach of the Licence conditions and a statutory noise nuisance. After discussion is was decided that a review of the premises licence was required due to the unsuitability of the premises to hold live music and 'disco' type events that were causing neighbouring premises to be unable to enjoy the material use of their homes.

The licence premise is comprised of three storeys and is part of a terrace that adjoins Oakfield properties building at the top end of Station Road and the corner of the junction with Devonshire Road. The front entrance of the Royal George opens onto Station Road. The windows and doors to the premises are single glazed. Haig House, Devonshire Road, referred to later in the review papers is located directly adjacent to the Royal George separated by a small walkway between Haig House and the Royal George. The main source of complaints received by the council relating to disturbance from noise arises from the residents of Haig House, Devonshire Road, Hastings each of which are approximately 5 meters from the rear of the Royal George.

There is one other Licenced premises located nearby known as 'FLAIRZ' at the top of Havelock Road, however our records show there have been no recent complaints of public nuisance about Flairz from the public.

In general the area is predominantly residential, with the Priory Meadow shopping centre located 10 Meters to the East of the Premises (which is closed at night).









Having served review notification on the Premises Licence holder Mr Andrew Palmer, I received an email dated 5th December 2017 (**Document 10 attached**) from Mr Palmer alleging that I and/or The council have a vendetta against him. Of course this will be rebutted in the hearing and it should be noted that officers have acted within the law and via a graduated scheme of enforcement. It is the view of Environmental Health that the fabric of the building is not sufficient in terms of noise protection to hold loud music events and as such must act to protect the residents of neighbouring properties.

That, Mr Andrew Palmer as The Premises Licence Holder and Mr Andrew
Palmer, as the Designated Premises Supervisor are failing to promote the
licensing objective," the prevention of public nuisance".

The conditions attached to the licence have been persistently breached in that noise and noise from music and customers who attend the premises impact on the nearby residents. Specifically:

- A. Music played on the premises shall be at such a volume as to be no more than barely audible on the opposite side of Station Road up until 23:00 hrs and inaudible after that time each day as perceived by an authorised officer of Hastings borough Council;
- B. External tables and chairs shall be taken out of use by 23:00 hrs each day;
- C. Patrons shall not be permitted to take any drinks outside after 23:00 hrs each day.
- D. To ensure signs are displayed and maintained requesting customers to "Please leave quietly when departing and respect our neighbourhood."
- E. To monitor customers when outside to ensure that this achieved.

Noise from music and customers has been reported to be audible within residential premises by residents who live nearby, at the façade of nearby residential premises and on opposite side of Station Road, down into Queens Square by authorised officers of the council responding to complaints made to the councils out of hours service.

On the basis of the information gathered it has become necessary to initiate a review of the premises licence HOP50033, due to the ongoing non-compliance by the licence holder and designated supervisor. The grounds to support the application are set out below.

Supporting Information

The Royal George (Previously 'Franks Front Room')

The premises are comprised of three storeys and are part of a terrace that adjoins Oakfield properties building at the top end of Station Road and the corner of the junction with Devonshire Road. The front entrance of the Royal George opens onto Station Road. The windows and doors to the premises are single glazed. Haig House, Devonshire Road, referred to later in the review is located directly adjacent to the Royal George separated by a small walkway between Haig House and the Royal George. The main source of complaints received by the council relating to disturbance from noise arises from the residents of Haig House, Devonshire Road, Hastings each of which are approximately 5 meters from the rear of the Royal George. There is one other Licenced premises located nearby known as 'FLAIRZ' at the top of Havelock Road our records show there have been no recent complaints of public nuisance about Flairz from the public.

In general the area is predominantly residential, with the Priory Meadow shopping centre located 10 Meters to the East of the Premises (which is closed at night).

Regulated Activity

Regulated activity in the form of live and recorded music takes place on the ground floor at the front of the premises. There are three windows at the front of the premises and two doors leading out onto Station Road, all of which are single glazed.

Complaints

Since the premises reopened in July 2017 under the current Premises
Licence Holder, Mr Andrew Palmer as 'The Royal George'. There have been
complaints made about excessive noise emanating from the premises.
I attach a sample of complaints that have been received by the council that
have been recorded against the premises. I attached a list of complaints
(document 1) received since 2017. The incidents report noise from loud music
being audible in Haig House and Devonshire Road.

Noise Diary

Complainants 'A' who reside at Haig House have submitted a diary of the noise coming from The Royal George. I attach a noise diary, (document 2) for the period 05/08/2017 to 26/08/2017. The diary describes the noise and how it affected the complainants and where in their homes the noise can be heard. The diary lists 4 occasions when the complainants reported being able to hear noise from loud live music and some recorded music as well as accompanied singing by customers inside The Royal George. The complainants further describe that the music could be heard on the opposite side of Station Road.

The diary records that music and noise from patrons of The Royal George can be heard at Haig House between the hours of 21:00 and 01:00am The diary indicates that noise is also generated by customers standing on the opposite side of Station Road and that the doors to the premises were open.

The description of the noise as set in the diary accords with the most recent statement provided by the complainant, (Document 3).

A further incident of loud music at the premises on 10th November 2017 was recorded by complainant A on a subsequent diary (Document 4) and was corroborated by an officer from the Council's out of hours

service a Noise abatement notice was then served on Andrew Palmer on the 14th November 2017 (document 6)

Correspondence

Following the original complaint from the 5th August 2017 a meeting with the Premises Licence Holder Mr. Andrew Palmer was undertaken by an officer from Hastings Borough Council's Environmental Health department in conjunction with two officers from HBC's Licencing department, on the 9th August 2017. During the discussion Mr. Palmer agreed to keep the doors to Station Road closed when live bands were due to perform and he was advised to monitor the noise all around the premises and log all details either by hand or on computer and to train staff to do the same. Mr. Palmer was also asked to restore the signage asking people to leave quickly and quietly after re-decoration.

Following an incident of loud music on 12th August 2017 a letter was sent to Mr. Palmer (**Document 5**). A further telephone message was left for Mr. Palmer on 18th August 2017, after receiving a message to contact him about the letter and he was informed that the case had been added to the Council's out of hours referral list in order for officers to decide if a noise nuisance is being committed or not.

The incident of 10th November 2017 resulted in a Noise Abatement Notice (**Document 6**) being served on Mr. Palmer on 14th November 2017 and a letter accompanying the notice outlined the possibility of a review of the licence also being perused. A further telephone conversation with Mr. Palmer on 15th November 2017 followed during which it was explained to Mr. Palmer that he needs to be aware of the restrictions imposed by the notice and he declared that he would cease music at the venue for the time being.

The letters and associated correspondence show that the licence holder has been informed of complaints received and in addition he has been offered advice and guidance.

Witness Statements

To support the claims made by the occupants I have a witness statement from the Senior Environmental Health Officer Stewart Bryant, (**Document 7**).

On the 10th November 2017 the councils Senior Environmental Health Officer Stewart Bryant was called by the councils out of hours coordinator at 23:02 hours in relation to a reports from two residents of Haig house of noise disturbance in the form of loud music from The Royal George .The complainants reported that the level of volume was such that they could not go to bed and that the noise was also distressing one of the residents young baby, prior to phoning the councils out of hours service. Between the hours of 23:30 hours and 23:55 hours Stewart Bryant made observations from the top of Station Road, directly opposite the premises, the top end of Middle Street and within Queens Square. During the period of observation the officer witnessed and heard noise generated from premises at a volume in breach of the licencing conditions with increased volume as individuals entered or left the premises. The statement describes in detail the volume level and the small amount of patrons within the premises during the period.

The Principal Complainants

The Residents of Haig House

Haig House is residential accommodation formed of separate flats. As part of the investigation residents of the Haig House have regularly complained of being disturbed by noise from music from The Royal George since August 2017.

Specifically there have been persistent complaints from the occupants (Document 8) of one particular flat over a period of 3 months 'COMPLAINANT 'A'. The complainant has suffered sleep deprivation, which

affects his work.

An email Dated 11th November 2017 from COMPLAINANT 'A' sets out the issues affecting him ad requests a formal review of the premises license.

Devonshire road

The statement (**Document 9**) dated the 5th December 2017 from COMPLAINANT 'B', at Devonshire Road sets out the circumstances surrounding events during the period August 2017 – December 2017. The complainants home is directly opposite The Royal George and is approximately 25 meters from the premises. The complainant reports being disturbed by noise from music and anti-social behaviour identified as coming from The Royal George, it is also reported that the police have attended the premises regarding fights outside The Royal George on several occasions in the last 6 months.

The Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor

The Licence Holder is Mr Andrew Palmer of the Hollington Oak Public House, Wishing Tree Road; St Leonards on Sea He is also the DPS. Our records show that Andrew Palmer has been the premises licence holder since June 2017.

A designated premises supervisor (DPS) is an individual who holds a valid personal licence and is named on the premises licence which authorises the sale by retail and alcohol. The DPS is the key person who will usually be charged with the day to day management of the premises by the premises licence holder.

The Licence holder Mr Palmer has a duty under the Licensing Act 2003 to promote all the licensing objectives one of which is the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The council have routinely corresponded with Palmer inviting comment including a meeting with the premises license holder, but at no time has Palmer engaged with Licencing or Environmental Health with regard to a formal strategy to resolve the issues of noise from music and customers.

Summary

In summary from the information collected over the previous months provides evidence that noise is generated through the playing of music on the premises (The Royal George) and customers who stand outside the premises. Noise escapes from the premises through the single glazed windows and doors and the structure of the building. The music is described as being accompanied by a heavy bass beat and noise from patrons outside the premises.

The licence holder has been offered advice from council to assist them with compliance with the current licence conditions. The licence holder / designated premises supervisor has not fully engaged with the council to resolve the complaints of public nuisance. Complaints continue to be received about noise from music and customers from the premises and the premises remains on the council emergency out of hours register for duty EHO's to attend if required.

Conclusion

On the basis of the supporting evidence it is my opinion that due to the lack of the sound proofing measures currently in place, the current fabric of the building cannot prevent the escape of noise from the premises. There is evidence that noise from music escapes from the front entrance doors and ground floor windows and the rear of the premises. The supporting evidence

shows that noise from customers who stand outside the front of the premise and the music levels continue to disturb nearby residents.

Due to the age of the building and the current building fabric it is noted that the premises is not suited to either live or loud recorded music as the singled glazed window provide no attenuation of low frequency noise, when the licence was granted to the former licensee's at 'FRANKS FRONT ROOM' the premises was never intended for use as a disco or events involving loud amplified live bands. The condition relating to audibility was a significant reason why the licence at that time was granted, so that it could be controlled in the event of acoustic type performances. The premises has advertised a variety of up and coming events (Photograph 1&2)

It is possible for staff to alleviate noise from customers and background music can be kept to a level so as not to disturb nearby residents, whereby live and disco music may not. The evidence indicates that the underlying cause of the problems arising from the licensable activities is as a result of the lack of proper management and the fabric of the building.

The review does not seek revocation or suspension of the premises licence but I ask that the committee considers the recommendations as set out below.

Recommendations

It is requested that the committee considers the following:

- Removal from the Licence of live and recorded music after the hour of 23:00 hrs Monday to Sunday.
- The licence should be conditioned as such to remove the exemptions under the Live Music Act 2012 to allow recorded and Live music (including unamplified music) at the premises between 08:00hrs and 23:00hrs.

- A Reduction in night time hours of operation as follows,
- Monday to Thursday from 00:30 hrs to 23:00 hrs
- Friday and Saturday from 00:30 hrs to 23:30 hrs.
- Sunday from 23:30 hrs to 23:00 hrs

Noise, music and patrons shall not be audible in any residential premises at any time.

With the following conditions being attached to the revised licence:

That the first sentence of Annex 2-condition 15 is amended to the following to read, noise and music arising from the premises shall not be audible in any residential premises. (Document 9 -Annex 3).

- Supervision shall be exercised on patrons at all times outside the premises in Station road/ Devonshire road to ensure they refrain from shouting, singing or other rowdy behaviour at any time and anyone failing to comply with a request to be quiet or to comply with the restriction shall be refused entry or re-entry to the premises or further service of drinks. From Monday to Thursday a responsible member of staff shall be in attendance in the vicinity of the exits and to assist with the dispersal 30 minutes after the licensable activity has ceased.
- A tamper-proof noise limiting device shall be installed (and maintained).
 All amplified equipment used at the premises must be connected through the said noise limiter. The volume level to be set, following agreement by an authorised officer of Hastings Borough council, Environmental Health.
- Persons using the front of the building, at Station Road and Devonshire Road shall not be permitted to take drink out with them.
- Where the premises operate with background music all doors and windows at the front and rear of the premises are to remain closed, save for access and egress.

His plans for a more food-led approach to the pub that he enlightened you with can't come quick enough. The food will help soak up all the cheap booze he is promoting in bulk quantity deals. I attach a photo of his latest promotion on posters filling the pub's street facing windows and chalked on blackboards on the outside of the pub.

In case you are unable to open the image, the poster says:

Dirty Thursdays Just got dirtier at The Royal George 4 x Sambucas £5 Any spirit with post mix only £2 Fancy a Threesome??? Any 3 bottles of Bud, Stella or Corona Only £6 Longman Best Bitter £2 a pint Wadworth IPA 2.50 a pint

I wonder if the Mayor and the HBC department responsible for promoting Hastings are comfortable with the image presented by these promotions, visibly situated at the entrance to the Priory Meadow Shopping Mall, the main thoroughfare from the train and bus stations for visitors to Hastings, and the route for young foreign schoolkids from Sussex Coast College.

licence holder and DPS of the Royal George Philimresponse to your complaint. The full implications of the premises licence were discussed with the operator and clear guidance/instruction passed as how we would expect the premises to operate and not cause a disturbance to local residents.

We all felt reassured by the Reponses given by the operator and hopefully the matter will not surface again. It was also pleasing to note that improvements to the premises internally are progressing and ongoing and it was clearly explained that future plans will be more food led.

I must reiterate my earlier comments to you, should noise problems resurface they must be reported to our Environmental Protection team, using the "Out of hours" service if it is beyond normal working hours. Such reports build up an evidence case should it be needed for prosecution and give authorised officers the opportunity to witness the events that are being complained about.

Hopefully this early intervention by officers demonstrates our desire to resolve problems to the satisfaction of residents when they are identified.

I am sorry if that is how my reply came across that was not the intention, it was an attempt to give you a factual reply to your questions, as you, by your own words, admitted to being confused. You had clearly done some research into the legislation but that had not resolved your queries and had in fact caused more confusion.

The situation with premises licence transfers is usually a simple and seamless process, in this case it was not and has followed the (long) legal process properly.

When a transfer is notified to the Licensing authority it happens simultaneously and the premises can open immediately, provided a DPS is in place. The period of 14 days representation then starts, if the police object on crime grounds in that time scale a hearing has to held within the next 20 working days. During this time the licence can remain in the new hands (and trade) until the committee is held and a decision made. If the decision is made to refuse the transfer, the premises licence refers back to the original licence holder and the premises closes and the process can start again.

A precis of the timeline is below for the Royal George PH, names have been removed to comply with data

protection.

9th January 2014. Premises closed but licence still live and held by a local Ltd Company.

10th March 2017. Existing Ltd company lease the premises to a new operator.

16th March 2017. Premises licence transferred to a new Ltd company, a director of which was the person you have referred to, Mr Lewis.

16th March 2017. New DPS, a lady, is put in place. She is known to this authority having worked at another property.

28th March 2017. Police lodge objection to transfer of premises licence.

24th April 2017. Transfer refused at committee and handed back to existing licence holder (Ltd company) Premises ceases trading.

28th April 2017. Existing Ltd company transfer the licence again, this time to the lady who was the DPS and is also going to be the new DPS as well.

16th May 2017. Lady withdraws her consent to be DPS on the premises, she also now notifies a transfer to new male operator who also applies to be the new DPS.(again someone who has been in the trade locally)

26th May 2017. Police object to the transfer.

27th June2017. Hearing held and transfer refused and now reverted back to the lady existing holder.

27th June 2017. Lady transfers licence to the old existing Ltd company.

27th June 2017. Ltd company now transfers the licence to the current operator who is also the DPS.

Current position we are now working with Environmental protection to resolve your noise complaint with the current licence holder/DPS. I can assure you that at no time has this premises been trading without a licence or the appropriate DPS in position.

You will note that this one premises has given this department a lot of work in a very short time scale, somewhat to the detriment of the other 400 such licences we cover in the Borough.

Mr Brown,

Thank you for your patronising and somewhat hostile response to a perfectly legitimate request for clarification on the process for approving license applications at HBC.

It is still unclear to me who was the DPS of the Royal George when it re-opened on 16th March, 2017, and who held the premises licence. The objection from Sussex Police to Mr. Lewis wasn't posted until 28th March, 2017. Which suggests that someone was operating the pub with a personal license during the intervening period. Or maybe it was operated without a license? In which case there seems to me to be a huge hole in the law, which perhaps should be referred to the Home Secretary.

Your 'well drilled' out of hours noise nuisance alert process is not really that comforting, if it means being regularly disturbed in the early hours of the morning and having to then make phone calls to your office. It took three years for the Zar Zar bar to have its licence revoked after repeated complaints about nuisance.

I don't detect any understanding of our concerns as neighbouring residents of this pub with a late night entertainment allowance that allows the playing of music until 1.30am. Only recognition (and support) of the rights of licensees and their businesses. So, in future, perhaps I need to take up my complaints with the police who may be more sympathetic, and whose visits to the premises may have more effect in getting the licensee to rethink his late night music policy.

Mr Grimshaw,

I will try and answer your comments one at a time as you are clearly confused.

Under the Licensing act 2003 there are two different licences, one is a personal licence (This is required by persons who wish to serve alcohol and Act as Premises Designated premises Supervisor (DPS)) (all licensed premises selling Alcohol need one such person before alcohol can be sold). The second is a premises licence, this for a premises that can sell alcohol and have certain types of Regulated entertainment. It is what it says, a premises licence and is issued to the place, not the person.

The person you refer to was never granted a personal licence by HBC (the information you refer to from the government site is about applying for a personal licence), Mr Lewis applied many years ago for such a licence and was refused due to our objections and those of the police because of his convictions. He did hold the premises licence for Zar Zar Bar, but was not the DPS, he employed someone else to fulfil that role. The licence for that premises was reviewed by the police following several crime incidents, major changes to its conditions were added and Mr Lewis could not fulfil those requirements and he was eventually ejected from the premises by the freeholder. (The premises never opened after the review) It is now under new management and a wine bar.

In the case of the Royal George PH, the licence for the premises has been held continually since its transfer from the court, it was the Court that granted it initially. The premises has closed several times since and changed hands but the licence has never been surrendered and therefore has remained in force, albeit with

a new operator. In these circumstances, it is all resolved by the transfer process and as I explained previously you as local resident (or us) have no say in that process, it is only the police.

As to the noise issues, we have a well drilled "out of hours" process managed by the environmental protection department, it needs persons to ring in, in order that authorised officers can witness the problems and take enforcement action. No such calls have been made to my knowledge.

I did not say that HBC cannot decline or challenge applications, only the transfer process for existing licences. All new application and variations go through a full representation period and we can challenge them along with other agencies or local residents.

The issue of irresponsible sales is again an area addressed by both the police and trading standards, however when I consider it alongside other such promotions around the Borough, I doubt it fits the criteria.

I am unable to convince you about the current owner, however we are aware of his previous history and have no reason to believe that he is in any way connected to Mr Lewis, who we know has now left the area.

I hope this assist you in your understanding of a large and complicated area of law. Should the problems sadly continue, hopefully you now understand the process of making complaints, this will assist officers to consider further action/prosecution.

Mr Brown,

Thank you for your email. I am confused as to the process for approving licence applications at HBC. Maybe you can provide some further clarification on the following.

The Gov.UK website on Alcohol Licencing Guidance says that:

Your local council will want to know of any relevant criminal convictions, and these may impact on whether or not you're found to be suitable as a licensee. You will also need to provide a basic criminal conviction disclosure form.

So, it surprises me that a license was granted by HBC to a convicted arsonist, who had quite recently had a

license taken away from him for another bar in the borough (I believe Zar Zar bar on Queen's Road) after several years' of multiple complaints from the police and public. In one incident a customer suffered a fractured skull I believe. And the licensee himself was arrested outside his bar in possession of a gun in another incident. This information is all publicly available in the police opposition to the granting of the license. If these aren't sufficient reasons to decline a new application to run a licensed premises, then I don't know what you have to do to be considered 'unsuitable'. Are you saying that HBC has no powers to decline a license application? That only the police can oppose an application after the license has been granted?

The Gov. UK guidance also states that:

You can make representations or comments to the council about applications for new licenses, variations or reviews. Comments may be positive or negative, but will only be considered relevant by the council if they relate clearly to the licensing objectives: the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; prevention of public nuisance; or the protection of children from harm.

We neighbouring residents were never alerted to the application of a license for this pub which had been shut for three years. Had we been aware, we would have opposed the granting of a late night entertainment license that enables the playing of live music until 1am and recorded music until 1.30am, which, surely, constitutes 'public nuisance' to those living next door to this pub. What is the process at HBC for involving neighbours in such license applications?

As you point out in your email, the licensee was operating under his licensed hours with the playing of live rock music until midnight, and could have continued until 1am. So we have to suffer the inevitable noise disturbance. As I pointed out in my earlier email there are young children living in this block of apartments and someone who works early morning shifts.

The Gov.UK site also quotes the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order 2014, which bans the sale of alcohol in irresponsible promotions. I am curious as to whether you think the posters that now fill the pub's windows promoting '4 shots of tequila for £5' are evidence of a responsible attitude to responsible drinking?

I look forward to receiving your clarification on the above.

Finally, you say that this licensee has no connection to the previous operator who was eventually refused a license after police objections. You may be right. I have no evidence to the contrary. I will merely point out a number of coincidences.

The pub, formerly known as Frank's Front Room, was shut for three years. The property was extensively marketed by local estate agents, but for three years they were unable to find anyone interested to buy it or rent it. Then along comes a person who has recently lost a license on a bar he owned and takes out a license on Frank's Front Room, renaming it The Royal George. There was no refurbishment of the pub, which is rather shabby to say the least. His marketing ploy was to advertise cheap lager and cider in hand written posters stuck to the pub windows. Then he has his license rescinded, and the license is transferred to a second person with no connection to the pub trade who after only a few weeks transfers it to a third person. The police then object to this third person's license and the pub closes down for a couple of months. Then the original applicant who has had his license rescinded, returns to the pub and sticks scrawled hand written posters on the pub windows advertising 'Business Opportunity: Call Nigel' with a mobile phone number. Within a week a fourth applicant turns up to your offices and takes out a license. The pub re-opens without any refurbishment with the same name, the same marketing ploy – hand written, scrawled posters promoting cheap booze - and what looks to me like the same clientele. I do wonder why the current licensee, who you say is already in the pub trade, didn't find this pub an interesting proposition before, during the three years it was shut.

Your e mail to one of my team (Mr Scrase) concerning the Royal George PH has been forwarded to me for investigation and reply.

I am sorry to hear of your problems with noise from the premises and as such intend to deal with this in three ways, 1. I have forwarded your complaint to the Council Environmental Protection team who deal with noise nuisance for their information and recording, they may make separate contact with you. 2. I will be visiting the premises with colleagues and discussing the complaint with the designated premises supervisor and Licence holder. 3. We will also take the opportunity to view the CCTV from the premises and our own town CCTV system to view, if possible, the street disturbance that you comment upon.

The licence breach that you refer to is in connection with noise escape, the premise does appear to have been operating within its licence hours.

In response to your comments about HBC's role in issuing licences, I think it important to clarify the way the Licensing Act 2003 works as you clearly have some misunderstandings.

This premises transferred its existing licence from the Magistrates court to HBC in 2005. It was then called the Priory PH.

In 2012 the premises became Franks Front Room, subsequently the premises closed for several years and earlier this year the licence holder has transferred it into new occupiers. (Now called The Royal George)

These licence transfers are normally administrative matters attracting no adverse comments. However in exceptional circumstances, only the Police have a period of 14 days in which to apply for the transfer to be challenged in a licensing committee on crime grounds. In this case they have done this on two occasions and on both the licence transfer has been stopped and the licence reverted back to the old holder.

The recent third transfer to the latest occupier was not challenged and the premises licence is correctly held. This person has no connection with the previous operator (the Mr Lewis you refer to). They are in fact a person who is already operating at another venue in the Borough and is fully licensed already. As to the persons frequenting the bar, he has limited ability to vet them and provided they do not cause the current licence holder a problem I am sure he will welcome trade.

The Borough has limited powers in respect of such transfers and cannot reject applications as you suggest, the law is very specific on our role and that of the police and yes in such circumstances we have to rely on them challenging applications, which to date they have done successfully.

Hopefully this explains the matter to you, I can assure you that we will Act upon supported evidence of licence breaches.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1990 – NOISE COMPLAINT ADDRESS: The Royal George, 31-32 Station Road, Hastings, East Sussex, TN34 1NJ,

I regret that I have to draw your attention to a complaint received by this section about noise from the above premises.

The complaint relates to: Noise from loud music, as well as shouting and singing from patrons both inside and outside the premises. The incident was alleged to have taken place over Saturday night-Sunday morning, $5^{th} - 6^{th}$ August 2017.

If this is indeed the case, and I have no reason, presently, to doubt the information provided, I must advise you that any repetition is likely to constitute a statutory nuisance and result in a noise abatement notice being served on you. The effect of such a notice would be to make any further incident of nuisance an offence punishable, on conviction in the Magistrates Court, by a fine of up to £20,000.

Incidents of this nature could also result in a review of your licence being requested by those affected or this section under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.

I hope that, with your co-operation, neither course of action will become necessary.

If you wish to discuss this matter further please do not hesitate to contact me.

Mr Brown,

Thank you for your patronising and somewhat hostile response to a perfectly legitimate request for clarification on the process for approving license applications at HBC.

It is still unclear to me who was the DPS of the Royal George when it re-opened on 16th March, 2017, and who held the premises licence. The objection from Sussex Police to Mr. Lewis wasn't posted until 28th March, 2017. Which suggests that someone was operating the pub with a personal license during the intervening period. Or maybe it was operated without a license? In which case there seems to me to be a huge hole in the law, which perhaps should be referred to the Home Secretary.

Your 'well drilled' out of hours noise nuisance alert process is not really that comforting, if it means being regularly disturbed in the early hours of the morning and having to then make phone calls to your office. It took three years for the Zar Zar bar to have its licence revoked after repeated complaints about nuisance.

I don't detect any understanding of our concerns as neighbouring residents of this pub with a late night entertainment allowance that allows the playing of music until 1.30am. Only recognition (and support) of the rights of licensees and their businesses. So, in future, perhaps I need to take up my complaints with the police who may be more sympathetic, and whose visits to the premises may have more effect in getting the licensee to rethink his late night music policy.

I will try and answer your comments one at a time as you are clearly confused.

Under the Licensing act 2003 there are two different licences, one is a personal licence (This is required by persons who wish to serve alcohol and Act as Premises Designated premises Supervisor (DPS)) (all idensed premises selling Alcohol need one such person before alcohol can be sold). The second is a premises licence, this for a premises that can sell alcohol and have certain types of Regulated entertainment. It is what it says, a premises licence and is issued to the place, not the person.

The person you refer to was never granted a personal licence by HBC (the information you refer to from the government site is about applying for a personal licence), Mr Lewis applied many years ago for such a licence and was refused due to our objections and those of the police because of his convictions. He did hold the premises licence for Zar Zar Bar, but was not the DPS, he employed someone else to fulfil that role. The licence for that premises was reviewed by the police following several crime incidents, major changes to its conditions were added and Mr Lewis could not fulfil those requirements and he was eventually ejected

from the premises by the freeholder. (The premises never opened after the review) is now under new management and a wine bar.

In the case of the Royal George PH, the licence for the premises has been held continually since its transfer from the court, it was the Court that granted it initially. The premises has closed several times since and changed hands but the licence has never been surrendered and therefore has remained in force, albeit with a new operator. In these circumstances, it is all resolved by the transfer process and as I explained previously you as local resident (or us) have no say in that process, it is only the police.

As to the noise issues, we have a well drilled "out of hours" process managed by the environmental protection department, it needs persons to ring in, in order that authorised officers can witness the problems and take enforcement action. No such calls have been made to my knowledge.

I did not say that HBC cannot decline or challenge applications, only the transfer process for existing licences. All new application and variations go through a full representation period and we can challenge them along with other agencies or local residents.

The issue of irresponsible sales is again an area addressed by both the police and trading standards, however when I consider it alongside other such promotions around the Borough, I doubt it fits the criteria.

I am unable to convince you about the current owner, however we are aware of his previous history and have no reason to believe that he is in any way connected to Mr Lewis, who we know has now left the area.

I hope this assist you in your understanding of a large and complicated area of law. Should the problems sadly continue, hopefully you now understand the process of making complaints, this will assist officers to consider further action/prosecution.

Mr Brown,

Thank you for your email. I am confused as to the process for approving licence applications at HBC. Maybe you can provide some further clarification on the following.

The Gov.UK website on Alcohol Licencing Guidance says that:

Your local council will want to know of any relevant criminal convictions, and these may impact on whether or not you're found to be suitable as a licensee. You will also need to provide a basic criminal conviction disclosure form.

So, it surprises me that a license was granted by HBC to a convicted arsonist, who had quite recently had a license taken away from him for another bar in the borough (I believe Zar Zar bar on Queen's Road) after several years' of multiple complaints from the police and public. In one incident a customer suffered a fractured skull I believe. And the licensee himself was arrested outside his bar in possession of a gun in another incident. This information is all publicly available in the police opposition to the granting of the license. If these aren't sufficient reasons to decline a new application to run a licensed premises, then I don't know what you have to do to be considered 'unsuitable'. Are you saying that HBC has no powers to decline a license application? That only the police can oppose an application after the license has been granted?

The Gov. UK guidance also states that:

You can make representations or comments to the council about applications for new licenses, variations or reviews. Comments may be positive or negative, but will only be considered relevant by the council if they relate clearly to the licensing objectives: the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; prevention of public nuisance; or the protection of children from harm.

We neighbouring residents were never alerted to the application of a license for this pub which had been shut for three years. Had we been aware, we would have opposed the granting of a late night entertainment license that enables the playing of live music until 1am and recorded music until 1.30am, which, surely, constitutes 'public nuisance' to those living next door to this pub. What is the process at HBC for involving neighbours in such license applications?

As you point out in your email, the licensee was operating under his licensed hours with the playing of live rock music until midnight, and could have continued until 1am. So we have to suffer the inevitable noise disturbance. As I pointed out in my earlier email there are young children living in this block of apartments and someone who works early morning shifts.

The Gov.UK site also quotes the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order 2014, which bans the sale of alcohol in irresponsible promotions. I am curious as to whether you think the posters that now fill the pub's windows promoting '4 shots of tequila for £5' are evidence of a responsible attitude to responsible drinking?

I look forward to receiving your clarification on the above.

Finally, you say that this licensee has no connection to the previous operator who was eventually refused a license after police objections. You may be right. I have no evidence to the contrary. I will merely point out a number of coincidences.

The pub, formerly known as Frank's Front Room, was shut for three years. The property was extensively marketed by local estate agents, but for three years they were unable to find anyone interested to buy it or rent it. Then along comes a person who has recently lost a license on a bar he owned and takes out a license on Frank's Front Room, renaming it The Royal George. There was no refurbishment of the pub, which is rather shabby to say the least. His marketing ploy was to advertise cheap lager and cider in hand written posters stuck to the pub windows. Then he has his license rescinded, and the license is transferred to a second person with no connection to the pub trade who after only a few weeks transfers it to a third person. The police then object to this third person's license and the pub closes down for a couple of months. Then the original applicant who has had his license rescinded, returns to the pub and sticks scrawled hand written posters on the pub windows advertising 'Business Opportunity: Call Nigel' with a mobile phone number. Within a week a fourth applicant turns up to your offices and takes out a license. The pub re-opens without any refurbishment with the same name, the same marketing ploy – hand written, scrawled posters promoting cheap booze - and what looks to me like the same clientele. I do wonder why the current

licensee, who you say is already in the pub trade, didn't find this pub an interesting proposition before, during the three years it was shut.

Your e mail to one of my team (Mr Scrase) concerning the Royal George PH has been forwarded to me for investigation and reply.

I am sorry to hear of your problems with noise from the premises and as such intend to deal with this in three ways, 1. I have forwarded your complaint to the Council Environmental Protection team who deal with noise nuisance for their information and recording, they may make separate contact with you. 2. I will be visiting the premises with colleagues and discussing the complaint with the designated premises supervisor and Licence holder. 3. We will also take the opportunity to view the CCTV from the premises and our own town CCTV system to view, if possible, the street disturbance that you comment upon.

The licence breach that you refer to is in connection with noise escape, the premise does appear to have been operating within its licence hours.

In response to your comments about HBC's role in issuing licences, I think it important to clarify the way the Licensing Act 2003 works as you clearly have some misunderstandings.

This premises transferred its existing licence from the Magistrates court to HBC in 2005. It was then called the Priory PH.

In 2012 the premises became Franks Front Room, subsequently the premises closed for several years and earlier this year the licence holder has transferred it into new occupiers. (Now called The Royal George)

These licence transfers are normally administrative matters attracting no adverse comments. However in exceptional circumstances, only the Police have a period of 14 days in which to apply for the transfer to be challenged in a licensing committee on crime grounds. In this case they have done this on two occasions and on both the licence transfer has been stopped and the licence reverted back to the old holder.

The recent third transfer to the latest occupier was not challenged and the premises licence is correctly held. This person has no connection with the previous operator (the Mr Lewis you refer to). They are in fact a person who is already operating at another venue in the Borough and is fully licensed already. As to the persons frequenting the bar, he has limited ability to vet them and provided they do not cause the current licence holder a problem I am sure he will welcome trade.

The Borough has limited powers in respect of such transfers and cannot reject applications as you suggest, the law is very specific on our role and that of the police and yes in such circumstances we have to rely on them challenging applications, which to date they have done successfully.

Hopefully this explains the matter to you, I can assure you that we will Act upon supported evidence of licence breaches.

Thank you for your e mail, I am sorry to hear of your ongoing problems with the premises. As you know I and colleagues spoke to the licence holder in August of this year and hoped that would result in the problems being resolved.

In the first instant I will discuss the weekend events with Mr Bryant when he comes into the office together with his manager. Depending on the evidence gained they can take several courses of action, one of which is to review the licence.

As you are aware you can yourself request a review of the licence, but the process is both time consuming and prescriptive. You must complete the attached form and seek a review against one or more of the 4 licensing objectives, giving as much supporting evidence as possible. The form must then be served by you on the premises licence holder, all other responsible authorities (details of which we can supply) and this department. We then place a public notice on the premises and we wait 28 days for other parties to join in if they so require.

A licensing review hearing is then held here and you together with any other complainants would be invited to attend.

Any decision reached at the hearing can then be subject to an appeal at court.

In the meantime I will discuss with colleagues as stated and I or colleagues get back to you with an update

Dear Mr. Brown,

I wish to request a licence review of the Royal George pub on Station Road, Hastings, which is adjacent to my residential property.

There are two fundamental reasons for this request.

1) The pub's licence allows the playing of music until 00.30 on weekdays and until 01.30 on Fridays and Saturdays. This licence is entirely unsuited to this pub which lies in a residential zone with an adjacent block of flats that houses young children. And is unsuited to the pub itself which has no double glazing or sound proofing, doors that go straight from the pub's lounge onto the street, and lots of windows in the music entertainment area that face the street.

There is a condition that music played on the premises should be barely audible on the opposite side of Station Road up until 23.00 and inaudible after 23.00. This condition is routinely ignored by the pub. Indeed, given its lack of soundproofing, as described above, it would be virtually impossible to meet this condition.

2) The pub is inadequately supervised. The Designated Premises Supervisor is unaware of the conditions of the pub's licence, there is no copy of the pub's licence on the premises, and no awareness that there is a residential block adjacent to the pub.

Last night I visited the pub to complain about the intolerable noise and found that the DPS was also the DJ. He was clad in headphones, oblivious to the deafening din he was creating (louder than any nightclub), oblivious to the noise disturbance he was making, and belligerently unreceptive to my complaint.

I have made numerous telephone complaints to HBC about noise disturbance from this pub for over three months now, and completed and returned a paper diary for 21 days as requested by HBC Environmental Health department. None of this has led to any change in behaviour by the Royal George.

Over the last 48 hours we have had to suffer loud live music played on Thursday evening until midnight with further noise disturbance from people leaving the pub and loitering outside for a further half hour. This on a weekday when my downstairs neighbour in Flat 2 was trying to sleep with her two-year old child, and while I was trying to sleep ahead of getting up early to go to work for a living. Then on Friday, the music began at 5pm and went on until midnight. It was so loud that I couldn't hear my TV set even when it is turned up to a very high volume....and I live on the top floor of the building. Both my neighbour in Flat 2, Jemma Eghart, and I put in telephone complaints to HBC. We were told that an inspector would visit, but it was taking so long, and the noise was so intolerable, we decided to visit the premises ourselves in an effort to get the volume turned down.

I tried to speak to the solitary barman to ask for the whereabouts of the DPS. He couldn't hear what I was saying. I had to scream into his face to get myself heard. His response was inaudible. But his gesticulating to the DJ suggested that the DPS was in fact the DJ. He was initially unreceptive to my complaint but when I advised him that I had complained to HBC he turned the volume down a bit. After we had left the pub an inspector from HBC arrived at the pub (Mr Bryan I believe). He subsequently told me that he found the noise unacceptable and would be filing an official complaint. But he hadn't heard how ear-splitting was the noise before his arrival.

I could go on and on....but I think there is already enough evidence from me with HBC about the continuous unacceptable disturbances from this pub, and my feelings about its dubious management.

Dear Mr. Brown,

I wish to request a licence review of the Royal George pub on Station Road, Hastings, which is adjacent to my residential property.

There are two fundamental reasons for this request.

1) The pub's licence allows the playing of music until 00.30 on weekdays and until 01.30 on Fridays and Saturdays. This licence is entirely unsuited to this pub which lies in a residential zone with an adjacent block of flats that houses young children. And is unsuited to the pub itself which has no double glazing or sound proofing, doors that go straight from the pub's lounge onto the street, and lots of windows in the music entertainment area that face the street.

There is a condition that music played on the premises should be barely audible on the opposite side of Station Road up until 23.00 and inaudible after 23.00. This condition is routinely ignored by the pub. Indeed, given its lack of soundproofing, as described above, it would be virtually impossible to meet this condition.

2) The pub is inadequately supervised. The Designated Premises Supervisor is unaware of the conditions of the pub's licence, there is no copy of the pub's licence on the premises, and no awareness that there is a residential block adjacent to the pub.

Last night I visited the pub to complain about the intolerable noise and found that the DPS was also the DJ. He was clad in headphones, oblivious to the deafening lin he was creating (louder than any nightclub), oblivious to the noise disturbance he was making, and belligerently unreceptive to my complaint.

I have made numerous telephone complaints to HBC about noise disturbance from this pub for over three months now, and completed and returned a paper diary for 21 days as requested by HBC Environmental Health department. None of this has led to any change in behaviour by the Royal George.

Over the last 48 hours we have had to suffer loud live music played on Thursday evening until midnight with further noise disturbance from people leaving the pub and loitering outside for a further half hour. This on a weekday when my downstairs neighbour in Flat 2 was trying to sleep with her two-year old child, and while I was trying to sleep ahead of getting up early to go to work for a living. Then on Friday, the music began at 5pm and went on until midnight. It was so loud that I couldn't hear my TV set even when it is turned up to a very high volume....and I live on the top floor of the building. Both my neighbour in Flat 2, Jemma Eghart, and I put in telephone complaints to HBC. We were told that an inspector would visit, but it was taking so long, and the noise was so intolerable, we decided to visit the premises ourselves in an effort to get the volume turned down.

It is disappointing that we have received this complaint, after our conversation last week.

If the complaint is justified and I have no reason, presently, to doubt the information provided, I must advise you that any repetition is likely to constitute a statutory nuisance and result in a noise abatement notice being served on you. The effect of such a notice would be to make any further incident of nuisance an offence punishable, on conviction in the Magistrates Court, by a fine of up to £20,000.

Incidents of this nature could also result in a review of your licence being requested by those affected or this section under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.

I hope that, with your co-operation, neither course of action will become necessary.

I am the above named person and have lived at 2016. The problems with loud music and shouting from patrons at the premises known as The Royal George, started as soon as the premises re-opened under the present licence holder in July 2017. The problems persisted into August 2017 with the major issues of loud music occurring at the weekends when live music was being performed by various groups at the Royal George. The incident of the 5th August 2017 went on until Midnight and the music was so loud that I could not hear my television above the noise and this was in my sitting room which is not adjacent to the Royal George. In my bedroom which is adjacent to the Royal George the music was so loud that it was impossible to sleep. There were further problems that night and on subsequent nights caused by patrons of the Royal George gathering on the corner of Station Road and Devonshire Road, immediately under my bedroom where the shouting and raised voices occurred both during and after the live music. The problems of loud music, raised voices and singing along to the music, from patrons of the Royal George continued in a similar vein over the ensuing diary entries for August 2017, which I exhibit as CG/01. The music continued to be a problem over the next two months. There were times when the music was tolerable although I could still hear the music in my flat. In November 2017 the music became extremely loud again and on 10th November 2017 I was forced to call the Hastings Borough Council out of hours service due to the volume of the music and the base beat reverberating in my sitting room. The noise from music in my hallway and bedroom was like being at a concert. Whilst waiting for the officer to arrive I went down to the Royal George to try and speak to someone about the noise. When I entered the Royal George the music was so loud that I had to shout to be heard at all. After asking the barman where the Designated Premises Supervisor was he pointed to the man acting as the DJ and the person responsible for the incredibly loud music. I approached this person and tried to explain the situation with the loud music in my flat. It was clear to me that he did not like being approached and I received no response until I pointed

out that he was in breach of his licence and he then told me to get out. At this time I also received verbal threats from patrons in the Royal George. When I returned to my flat the officer from the Council arrived and spoke to me about the noise and that he thought it was unacceptable. I pointed out to him that the person identified as the Designated Premises Supervisor had actually turned the music down a little whilst we talked and it had been louder than it was now. Just after the officer left the person identified as the Designated Premises Supervisor knocked on my door and said 'can we start again' I replied that I had spoken to the Council and there was nothing more to say at which point I closed the door. I am aware that a Noise Abatement Notice has been served on the premises as a result of this witnessing visit. The music which is a mixture of Rock, Soul and Dance music can happen from Thursday to Saturday The whole situation has been very stressful and does not help my heart condition due to the stress it causes. The tack of sleep also effects my concentration at work. I believe that the premises are unsuitable for music due to a combination of the numerous single glazed windows and poor management. I need the noise to stop so I can once again enjoy living in my own flat.

I regret that I have to draw your attention to a complaint received by this section about noise from the above premises.

The complaint relates to: Noise from loud music and people inside and outside the premises. The complaint relates to last Saturday night 12th August 2017.

It is disappointing that we have received this complaint, after our conversation last week.

If the complaint is justified and I have no reason, presently, to doubt the information provided, I must advise you that any repetition is likely to constitute a statutory nuisance and result in a noise abatement notice being served on you. The effect of such a notice would be to make any further incident of nuisance an offence punishable, on conviction in the Magistrates Court, by a fine of up to £20,000.

Incidents of this nature could also result in a review of your licence being requested by those affected or this section under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.

I hope that, with your co-operation, neither course of action will become necessary.

TAKE NOTICE that HASTINGS BOROUGH COUNCIL ("the Council") is satisfied that a statutory nuisance is likely to recur from the premises known as The Royal George, 32 Station Road, Hastings, East Sussex, TN34 1NJ ("the premises"). The premises are located in the Council's area.

The statutory nuisance comprises the playing of amplified and acoustic music and noise from patrons inside and outside the premises so as to be a nuisance to occupiers of other premises in the vicinity ("the nuisance"). The nuisance is a statutory nuisance under Section 79(1)(g) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

This notice is served on you as a person responsible for the nuisance and an occupier of the premises.

THE COUNCIL HEREBY PROHIBITS the recurrence of the nuisance.

This notice takes effect immediately.

IF you fail to comply with any requirement of this notice, without reasonable excuse, you will be guilty of an offence punishable, on summary conviction, by a fine not exceeding £20,000.

FURTHER, if you fail to comply with any requirement of this notice, the Council may, whether or not proceedings are taken for an offence, abate the nuisance and do whatever may be necessary in execution of this notice and recover the expenses reasonably incurred from you. *(Note: this could include the seizure and detention of equipment used to play music.)

The Council may also take proceedings in the High Court, to obtain an injunction, for the purpose of securing the abatement, prohibition or restriction of the nuisance.

Paragraph (2) of regulation 3 of the Statutory Nuisances (Appeals) Regulation 1995 applies to this notice so, it shall NOT be suspended until any appeal has been abandoned or decided by the Court, as it is the Council's opinion that the nuisance to which this notice relates is such that the expenditure which would be incurred by any person in carrying out works in compliance with this notice before any appeal has been decided would not be disproportionate to the public benefit to be expected in that period from such compliance.

I am employed as a Snr Environmental Health Officer attached to the Environmental Protection Team of the Hastings Borough Council, Environmental Health Department. I have been in the employ of the council for over 15 years and hold a 1st class BSc (Hons) in Environmental Health from Middlesex University, A Membership of the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health and a Fellowship of the Royal Society of Public Health.

As such I am an authorised officer in respect of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. In addition to my day to day duties, I am also attached to the Council's Emergency 'Out of hours' team as a Duty Environmental Health officer. The Environmental health team operates a 24 hour service to respond to calls outside of normal office hours.

Just after 11 pm on Friday the 10th November 2017, I was contacted by the councils out of hours coordinator, to attend Devonshire Road, Hastings regarding a report of excessively loud music coming from the adjacent licensed premises known as the Royal George. The Royal George is located at the top of Station Road.

I arrived at 11:30 pm and parked my unmarked vehicle at the top end of Middle Street directly behind the Prior Meadow shopping centre. As I walked up the road towards the junction with Devonshire Road, Middle Street and Station Road I became aware of loud music emanating from somewhere in close proximity. I telephoned the complainant and informed them that I would conduct some observations from street level are there were specific licensing conditions regarding volume levels. She informed me that just before my arrival another neighbour had gone into the Royal George and asked them to turn it down. On

Continuation of statement of Stewart Edward Bryant reaching the junction the music became louder and it was obvious that the noise was coming from the Royal George public house in Station Road. The Premises has several single glazed windows and two single glazed doors to the front and side of the premises. The music which was emanating from a DJ Type set up was clearly audible in the street. The premises is licenced to a Mr Andrew Palmer, who has been written and spoken too by the Environmental Health and Licensing Team regarding levels of noise from the premises. The current licence also states the following conditions: "Music played on the premises shall be at such a volume as to be no more than barely audible on the opposite side of Station Road up until 23:00 hrs and inaudible after that time each day as perceived by an authorised officer of Hastings borough Council". I walked around the corner into the top of station road to the point mentioned in the above and the music was clearly audible, being both a breach of the notice and a Statutory Noise Nuisance. The premises was almost empty and the Barman was observed leaning over the bar looking out onto Station Road. On the right hand side of the pub was male standing by the windows with a DJ set up and loud bass driven music was clearly audible in the street about 12 meters from the premises at the monitoring point. I walked down into Queens Square and the loud music was still audible by the Hot Potato outlet within Queens Sq at 11:39 pm. The music became louder still when the door was open to let a female customer out. I continued down through Queens Square towards the town centre and then past the Clarence public house and back up Middle Street to the top end of Middle Street/Devonshire road. The music continued to be audible at the junction as before. I then contacted the second complainant also from and he explained that the noise had been even louder which had prompted him to go into the Royal George and ask the DJ who he stated was also the person in charge of the premises and ask them to turn the Disco music down. I explained to him that I had heard sufficient evidence that a statutory noise nuisance was taking place and that an abatement notice would be served on the premises. At 11:51 pm I returned to my vehicle and drove into the entry for the car park at Priory meadow shopping ctr which is located opposite the Royal George, the music still audible with the car


